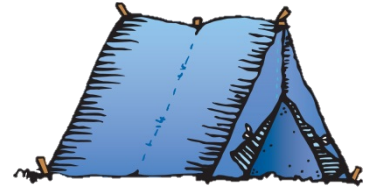




Our Week 1st Grade
