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2018-2019 DISNEYLAND PERFORMANCE TOUR BEHAVIOR CONTRACT

The FPS Wind Ensemble Disneyland Tour is a wonderful educational opportunity for students; however, with opportunity comes responsibility. That responsibility includes rehearsal behavior, maintaining attendance, and submitting all necessary documentation by designated deadlines. It is important for students and parents to understand that failure to comply to these responsibilities may cause the student to lose tour eligibility, and participation may be forfeited. It is important that the entire contract be read and understood fully.

Please READ and initial (both parent and student) after each section and sign at the conclusion of the contract.

1. "Three strikes, you're out" Policy: A serious safety or behavior rule infraction, as determined by the director with input from the chaperones, is a strike.

Strike 1: Warning, including discussion with chaperone and director.

(Example: Being late to an activity)

Strike 2: Director contacts parent; student earns a loss of time in activities.

(Example: Abandoning a chaperone)

Strike 3: Director contacts parent; student will be removed from all activities, all privileges will be revoked. Student may be sent home immediately at parents' expense. Strike 3 may include school consequences including suspension or loss of other privileges as determined by director and school administration.

(Example: Students being inside a room of a student of the opposite sex, no matter the reason.)

NOTE: ANY rule infraction that jeopardizes the safety of the student or group, including line jumping or inappropriate ride behavior (which may result in removal from the parks by park authorities), possession of illegal items, fighting, or leaving the hotel room for non-emergency reasons at ANY time after lights out, is considered an automatic third strike. This will result in immediate parent notification, student removal from all activities, and may result in the student being sent home immediately.

2. Students must remain academically eligible as determined by school standards. If a student does not maintain a cumulative grade of 70% or higher, the student may be ineligible to participate at the discretion of the director and administration.

3. Any student who receives any out of school suspension for any reason during the current school year may be ineligible to participate as determined by the director and administration

4. Students will be preparing performance material for the tour throughout the school year. It is imperative that students are present at all classes during each school week. When a student misses rehearsal, it affects the entire band. Therefore, TEN or more absences from August 6, 2018, to March 1 2019, will be considered excessive. TEN or more absences from rehearsal may result in loss of eligibility to attend the tour.

5. While on the tour, all students will stay with their assigned adult chaperones. No one will be allowed to walk the parks or leave designated locations without his/her specific chaperone. No student is allowed to leave the group for any reason.

6. All students must attend all programmed activities and be on excellent behavior. No one is excused from attending and participating in performances, except for extreme health reasons verified by the nurse and the director. Being late to any appointed time requirement will result in loss of free time in the parks.

7. Female students may not be in the room of a male student for any reason. Male students may not be in the room of a female student for any reason. Students who do not follow this rule will have an immediate third strike. Consequences may include loss of all tour privileges, and/or being sent home at parents' expense.

8. Students who carry cell phones assume all liability and responsibility for usage, charges, and loss. Inappropriate use of cell phones (including taking inappropriate pictures or sending inappropriate text messages) may result in the phone being confiscated for the remainder of the tour by the director or administrator. Administrators or directors have the authority and permission to examine any student's phone in the presence of other adults to determine inappropriate usage. In such cases, parents will be notified and, if inappropriate usage has been determined, the phone will be returned to the PARENT at the conclusion of the tour.

9. Texting a chaperone for permission to leave an area is not acceptable communication. Texting a chaperone or medical staff person at night in case of emergency IS acceptable as long as the adult responds in person. A student cannot assume a chaperone or medical staff has seen the text unless the adult responds and goes to the student's room in person. Students may NOT leave their rooms without an adult.

10. Students with any illegal substances or dangerous, illegal items in their luggage, backpacks, or on their person at any time during this trip will be subject to the fullest consequences. Possession of alcohol, illegal drugs, or anything prohibited by law or the Franklin Phonetic Handbook will not be tolerated. Incidents will be treated as the most serious infraction of the rules with consequences on the tour and upon returning to campus. Law enforcement will be contacted.

11. Students will follow all Franklin guidelines for behavior, dress, and grooming. These guidelines are specified in the Franklin Handbook. The Franklin dress code applies for the duration of the tour. Inappropriate dress will result in the student being sent back to the hotel to change. Extremely specific uniforms are REQUIRED for performance and must be worn.

12. Students will follow all guidelines for behavior as set by the directors and park rules. This means following ride rules, no line jumping, no graffiti, no vandalism, and no rude behavior. Students will leave all locations and items cleaner than they were found. Students will treat all bus and hotel property and equipment with respect. The students are representing their city, school, and family, and should act as such. Students will use language and behaviors that are respectful and appropriate.

13. Students will be prepared at all times. Students must have the required uniform parts to be allowed to perform. Students will make sure all uniform parts are purchased and approved by Mr. Rutt by February 1, 2019. It is the students responsibility to make sure to have all music, instruments, and parts necessary to perform.

14. Bus expectations:

- All passengers must remain seated once the coach approaches any city or while in mountainous terrain.
- No wet bodies will be allowed on the coach. Wet clothes must be put inside a plastic trash bag.
- No hair spray, perfumes, or aerosol sprays are permitted on the coach.
- Only G, PG movies are allowed to viewed at any time.
- Snacks are permitted; however, chewing gum, sunflower seeds, or any variety of nuts in the shell are prohibited.

15. Students expectations:

- Loud noises, yelling and horseplay are prohibited, especially in hotels, restaurants, and on the bus.
- Students will leave any area cleaner than it was EVERYTIME they leave, including the bus, hotel room, or park locations.
- Students will respect all rules set by Masters' Touch, Embassy Suites, Medieval Times, and Disneyland.
- All extra expenses are the responsibility of the student (pay phone, souvenirs, food inside the park, etc.)
- Students are expected to eat and stay properly hydrated, before, during, and after all activities.
- It is the students' responsibility to communicate their physical condition if they feel ill at anytime.
- Students are expected to know the daily schedule and to attend all events on time.
- Only FPS contracted vehicles are to be ridden by students and designated chaperones.
- All medications and prescriptions must be kept in the possession of the director or administrator except for inhalers.
- No public displays of affection toward other persons are permitted at any time.
- Vulgar and profane language is not allowed at any time.
- Students will obey all "lights out" and "wake up" times and be on time to leave for the next activity.
- Students will respect other roommates who are sleeping or trying to sleep.
- Students will maintain a kind, polite, respectful, and safe attitude.
- Students will abide by all school rules as defined in the Franklin Handbook.
- The student realizes that that he/she is representing their city, school and family and will act accordingly.
- A safe, positive, and educational atmosphere is to be maintained at all times.
