#### Reading:

We will continue writing words into our class Spalding notebook for future reading and spelling words. We are reading picture books, deciding if the story is a narrative or an informative or informative-narrative. We are also answering comprehension questions about the story as we read. We will be reviewing our sight words on flashcards and creating sentences using these words, then reading our sentences! We will be working on comprehending directional words / vocab: on, off, up, down, left, right, top, bottom, middle.

Handwriting: Write a,c,d,f,g,o,s,qu,b correctly starting at 2 o'clock. We will continue to work on writing e,h,i,j,k,l,m,n,p,r,t,u,v,w,x,y,z, er's, sh, ee, th, ay, ai staying between the lines. We are learning how to write words with ou, ow. We are continuing to use house paper during writing. Tall letters go in the attic, short letters are written where the person lives and some letters such as g, j, q, y go in the basement. We use this language in the classroom, it may be beneficial for them at home too!
