Spalding: Review: ones learned to date

Phonograms Tested: 00, ar, ck, ed, or, wh, ir,

ur, n, y, w, g, l, t, a, e, o, v, r, u

Phonograms being introduced: ei/ie, igh

Cut and paste: oa, ey

Your child's phonogram score may decrease due to more two letter phonograms being tested, this is normal and the scores will increase after more practice.

Phonogram pre-test is on Wednesday and our post-test is on Friday.

**Spelling words being tested**: not, my, we, am, good

Spelling pretest is on Tuesday and our post test is on Thursday.

Reading: Review high frequency words learned to date daily. We are reading picture books, deciding if the story is a narrative, informative or informative narrative. We are also answering comprehension questions about the story as we read.

## Language Arts: March Rainbow Poem- Due Wednesday, March 26th

We will be writing sentences on lined paper and illustrating the sentences. We are also learning to write complete sentences (capitalize first letter of first word, correct ending punctuation and words need to make sense). We will be learning what personal narratives, opinion pieces, and research writing projects are and explore them as a class.

Handwriting: We will continue to work on writing the phonograms /words we have learned so far in correct letter formation while staying between the lines. We will also be working on having the letters sit on the line, not floating above or sinking below the line.

Math: Counting 1-130; number recognition 1-100 (focus on 1-20); number that comes before and after; number that is greater; basic addition; making numbers up to 10; addition story problems; AB, ABC, ABB patterns; Review measurement; Review telling time to the hour; Basic addition review daily. Introduction of number bonds sums of 10

Science: Characteristics of animals and plants; needs of animals and plants; review living and non-living. Review measurement, planets.

Social Studies: Geography- Types of climates (deserts, plains, tundra). Review George Washington, Abraham Lincoln.
