Objectives for this week:

Spalding - Phonograms - **w and x**. Work on counting sounds in a given word. Writing practice of all phonograms. Review of a - z, using the Phonogram Circus DVD.

Reading - We will continue working on sight words and the importance of print.

Ways to help your child:

* Help your child practice writing letters from A to Z. Ask the student for the letter name and the letter sound.

- Please have your child listen to the Phonogram Circus DVD at home. This will be a great review tool.



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Math - Continue working on counting to 50 orally, written # 0 - 20, Identifying objects 1-20, charts / graphs, shapes and patterns. We are also starting to skip count by 2's.

Language Arts - Listening skills, following directions, word families, opposites, rhyming and identifying the plot of a story. We will also be working on learning the poem # 6.
