Phonograms this week: Hh and Ll

Poem #4



A FOUR gate in a garden has three lines, plain as day. One halfway down, one over, one straight down all the way.

Objectives for this week:

Spalding - Phonograms Hh and Ll Work on counting sounds in a given word. Writing practice of phonograms. Review of a, b, c, d, e, f, g, i, j, o, p, q, r, u, y using the Phonogram Circus DVD.

Reading - The fall months of kindergarten are a time to observe carefully, and offer support. Many children, especially those young for kindergarten, may just need a little more time to develop.

But if your child is really struggling, now is the time to ask careful questions: What experiences seem most challenging?



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Ways to help your child:

- * Help your child practice writing letters, especially the letters in their names.
- Run your finger under the words as you read to your child to help them learn that words go from left to right and top to bottom.
- Play games with rhyming words to help your child hear similar sounds in words. For example, as you are going up the stairs, name one word that rhymes with cat for each step as you go up.
- Give your child two and three step directions. For example: "put on your pajamas, brush your teeth and pick a book to read."
- Play Simon Says with two or three step directions. For example: "Simon Says jump up and down and shout hooray."
- Please have your child listen to the Phonogram Circus DVD at home. This will be a great review tool.

Math - Continue working on counting to 20 orally, written # 0 - 20, Identifying objects 1-20, charts / graphs and patterns. We are also starting to skip count by 2's.

Language Arts - Listening skills, following directions, word families, nouns, and identifying the characters in a story. We will also be working again this week on learning poem four. The oral test will be on Friday, October 4th.

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Science - This week we will continue working on Scientific Method and magnet exploration.

Social Studies - We will continue working on understanding the working parts of a community. What we can do as students for our communities.
