Spalding:

Phonograms to review: Aa - Zz. > ALL Phonograms being introduced: ow and ng.

They need to know them by sight, in and out of order. Please continue working on this at home with the flash cards and the Phonogram DVD's.

Handwriting: We will continue to work on writing the phonograms we have learned so far in correct letter formation. We are also working on staying between the lines and working on keeping the letters from floating above or below the lines. We are continuing to use house paper during writing. Tall letters go in the attic, short letters are written where the person lives and

some letters such as g, j, q, y go in the basement. All letters sit on a line except for j. (Backwards letters will be counted as incorrect)

Language Arts:
