Math - Continue working on counting to 100 orally, written # 0 - 75, Identifying objects 1-75, charts / graphs and patterns. We are also exploring counting backwards!

The exciting news is - We are now looking at number patterns and learning about place value. We are working on subtraction and addition. <u>Our papers will now have mixed signs that the students will need to pay attention to.</u>

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Please help your child accurately count to be correct. I ask the students to mark as the count out loud. This helps them stay one to one.

Language Arts - Listening skills, following directions, word families, verbs and nouns and identifying the details of a story or selection. We will also be working on listening skills and following multi - step directions.
