**Phonograms.** Oral and written phonogram practice occurs daily. Students will take a practice test on Thursday, and a final assessment on Friday. Thirty focus phonograms will be chosen each week and listed on the newsletter.

**Writing.** Daily writing practice will focus on the 6-traits of effective writing: Ideas, Organization, Word Choice, Sentence Fluency, Voice, and Conventions. We will also work on Paragraph editing, identifying errors and correcting them.

**Math.** Instruction will be focused on the Arizona Academic Standards.

### 5<sup>th</sup> grade

The number line, fractions, mixed numbers, negative numbers, problems about equal groups, rounding whole numbers and estimating.

### 6<sup>th</sup> grade

Measuring angles with a protractor, problems about parts of a whole and simple probability, equivalent fractions, reducing fractions, U.S. customary system and function tables.

**Science.** Mystery science and science weekly.

**Social Studies.** Social studies weekly: Mesopotamia
