Dear Penelope and Class,

I'm sorry it took so long to write back to you. Since I received your letter, there has been a lot of activity in Europe because of Russia, and it keeps us very busy.

Thank you for taking the time to write to us. I shared your letters with our office, the Defense Attaché Office at the US Embassy in Brussels. Many of us have deployed to Iran, Afghanistan, or other places, and it has been a long time since anyone wrote to thank us for our service. We all appreciate that you wrote to us.

I have had a great time serving in the Army for over 21 years. I have been able to visit over 45 countries and my family and I have been able to live in four countries outside the US. Some have been really nice (like Belgium where we are now) and some have been tougher places (like Niger, in West Africa, which is the poorest and least developed country in the world). But all of them have been amazing experiences, and we are grateful for the opportunity to do this.

I hope that some of you consider going into the military, regardless of the branch—the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard. It is a very challenging but rewarding experience, and one that you will not regret. You can always write back if you have any questions or want to talk more. But regardless, good luck in school and work hard, enjoy your time growing up, and take care of yourselves and each other.
